**Preliminary Itinerary for Munich, Salzburg, and Vienna, April 19 - 28, 2012**

Jan 9, 2012

**Thursday, April 19**

The departure by coach for Boston Logan is scheduled for 3:30 PM. All passengers arrive Boston Logan at 6:00 PM to check in for your non-stop flight to Germany, departing Boston for Munich on Lufthansa Flt. 425 at 8:20 PM, with meal service on the aircraft overnight.

**Friday, April 20**

At 9:45 AM, your flight arrives in Munich, Germany. All groups are met by your USIT tour conductor and your Austrian guide, and when everyone has arrived and loaded the luxury European touring coaches, we depart the airport for Munich and start our tour! We'll go by the Olympic Stadium, see the Frauenkirche, Munich's twin-spired Cathedral, spend a little time exploring Marienplatz, the city's central square and hope to see a performance of the famous Glockenspiel in the tower at the Munich Rathaus (city hall). In this capitol of Bavaria, we should tour through the government and historic districts, pass the Residenz, the rambling palace for the Wittlesbach rulers, and other significant sights. At 6:00 PM, we we have a full dinner at the Munich Wienerwald (incl.) at Anzingerstrasse 2, Munich, then on to our hotel for check in to retire early from a long day traveling from USA. **Saturday, April 21**

**7:00 AM** Breakfast at the hotel (all breakfasts in the package are included.) We check out of the Mercure Hotel and drive from Munich through the country towns on the way to the castle of Mad King Ludwig at Neuschwanstein near the small town of Fussen, Bavaria (adm. incl.) (Entrance times for the group *at the top of the hill*, are at X,Y, and Z.) Probably the most famous castle in the world, it was the inspiration for Disney's Magic Kingdom castle. We arrive at Neuschwanstein, organize to climb the trail up to the castle for a English tour of the castle. After the tour, time permitting, those who wish can walk over to the suspended bridge over the gorge for pictures, and then return to town. Lunch on your own in the Bavarian village. Then we depart for Salzburg, Austria, traveling from Germany to Austria though the famous alpine Fern Pass to arrive at our hotel at @ 6:00 PM, the four-star Renaissance Hotel Salzburg, close to the Salzach River and the Old Town, and prepare for **dinner at the hotel (incl.)**. After dinner, we will have a rehearsal at the hotel. **Sunday, April 22**

**7:30 AM** Breakfast at the hotel. Then, we drive the short way up into the mountains to Berchtesgaden, Germany, where the Alps begin and drive a little further to Koenigssee. Here we'll enjoy a boat ride and tour of the famous Koenigssee in the Berchtesgaden

National Forest (incl., 10:30 AM), the most photographed panorama in Germany, an alpine lake with forest and near vertical cliffs on its banks. The boat, with silent electric motor, crosses the lake and glides to a small peninsula to the ancient baroque chapel of St. Bartholomew, accessible only by water (adm. incl.) Lunch will be on our own at the café at St. Bartholomew or at one of the several restaurants in Koenigssee. Then we drive a short way to the Salt Mines in Berchtesgaden (incl.) for our tour deep inside the mountain, including a miniature train ride and underground boat ride. Then we return to our hotel in Salzburg to prepare for the evening's concert, departing at 5:30. After the concert, dinner is provided at a local restaurant (incl.) before we return to the hotel in Salzburg. Hotel: Ramada City Centre

### **Monday, April 23**

**7:30 AM** Breakfast at the hotel. Then we leave the hotel to start our walking tour of Salzburg at Mirabelle Gardens, one of the Sound of Music sites. We'll see Schloss Hellbrunn outside Salzburg at which the famous gazebo stands, and Schloss Leopoldskron (where Maria and the Baron danced on the balcony). From there, we continue to tour through the Old City "Altstadt" on foot, the best way to see it. This is a very compact area between the jutting outcrop of the Moenchsberg and the Salzach River. The rest of the Old City belonged to the wealthy burghers: the old market, the town hall, and the tall, plain burghers' houses like Mozart's Birthplace (adm. incl.). Our tour will include the Mozartplatz with its cafes and candy stores, the Residenz at the heart of Baroque Salzburg, the Dom and nearby St. Peter's Abbey. Your afternoon is free to shop and explore. **Dinner is on our own** in town at one of the many restaurants in Salzburg. Our guides will help you with suggestions. Hotel: Ramada City Centre

### **Tuesday, April 24**

**7:00 AM** Breakfast at the hotel. Then we leave Salzburg and enjoy our scenic drive towards Vienna, with our first touring stop at St. Florian's Abbey ("*Stift St. Florian*") (adm. incl.) for a tour of the abbey, including its magnificent library and Baroque cathedral. The composer Anton Bruckner was the organist here for ten years, and his tomb in the catacombs, which we can visit and the choir can sing briefly, is directly under the organ he so loved, the famous Krissman organ. Lunch is on our own along the way at one of the famous Rosenberger highway restaurants. We'll visit the city of Krems on the Danube along the way, a charming river town, with some time to explore for a little while. Late in the afternoon, we enter Vienna and drive through the city to arrive at our four-star hotel near the Westbahnhof to check in. After settling into our rooms, we come down at 7:00 or 7:30 to organize in chaperone groups to go out for **dinner on our own** at any of the fine restaurants in the area. After a full day of exploring, we retire for a well-earned sleep. ### **Wednesday, April 25**

After breakfast at the hotel, we'll depart on foot and walk to the center of Vienna, where we will have a guided tour of the State Opera House (incl.) at 9:00 AM sharp, and then

see a rehearsal of the famous lipizzans horses (adm. incl.) at the Spanish Riding School in the heart of Vienna. We'll have an early lunch on our own, and then we meet the coaches at 1:00 PM to depart for Gross Siegharts, north of Vienna about an hour and half, and on the way, we'll stop at **Rosenburg Castle at 3:00 PM**, where we will visit the Renaissance courtyard and see as short **demonstration of hunting birds**--hawks, eagles, and falcons. At 4:00 PM, we continue to a local town for our next concert. At 5:30, we change and set up for the concert, which will start at 7:00 PM. After the concert, we will go to dinner at a local restaurant (incl.), where we will meet townspeople and enjoy the meal. We depart at about 9:30 PM for Vienna and our hotel. Hotel: Arcotel Wimberger

#### **Thursday, April 26**

**8:30 AM** Breakfast at the hotel. This morning, you have some free time to explore Vienna and do some shopping. After lunch on our own, the coaches will pick us up downtown near the Opera house and we'll see some of the sights that are outside the city center, including the Hundertwasser House and the Composers' Cemetery with the grave sites of Schubert, Beethoven and other composers. **Dinner is on our own tonight**, but remember that tonight we attend the symphony, so we will need to be dressed and ready to leave the hotel by 7:30 PM. The concert is at 8:15 at the Vienna Residence Orchestra (incl.), performing Mozart and Strauss at the Palais Auersperg. Hotel: Arcotel Wimberger

#### **Friday, April 27**

**9:00 AM** Breakfast at the hotel. This morning, we start our city tour with a guided tour of Schoenbrunn Palace (incl.), where Mozart played for royalty as a child. The coaches will then return us downtown, where we will have lunch on our own and some free time for exploring and shopping on our own. We return to the hotel by 5:30 PM, and at 6:30 PM we depart for traditional Heurigen dinner (incl.) at 7:00 PM at Kronprinz Rudolfshof, with singing, great food, and good fun. We're back in the hotel by 10:00 PM to pack for our early departure in the morning. Hotel: Arcotel Wimberger

#### **Saturday, April 28—Return flights by group:**

Our departure from the hotel will be no later than 9:15 AM to arrive Vienna International airport by 10:00 for check-in. We depart Vienna at Munich at 12:15 PM on Lufhtansa Flt. 2329 and arrive Munich at 1:00 PM. There, we transfer to our Lufthansa Flt. 424 at 3:55 PM for Boston. Arrival Boston is at 6:25 PM. By 7:30, we will be boarding our coach for the drive back to Goffstown High school, where we expect to arrive at 8:30 PM.
