Dear MVMS Community,

Happy New Year! I hope our MVMS students and families had a fun and relaxing break. Our staff and students returned ready and eager to teach and learn last week.

With the winter months upon us, I wanted to share a reminder with families of what weather-related impacts to our school day could look like. In a weather emergency, Superintendent Balke may choose to implement a Distance Learning Day. On these occasions, students will participate in learning activities from home utilizing the Schoology platform. It is important to mention that each school in the district has a distinctive plan for Distance Learning Days, carefully crafted to meet the specific developmental needs of its student population.

Also, for your planning purposes, Superintendent Balke has designated January 23, 2024, as a Distance Learning Day. This decision is a result of several schools within the SAU being used for voting during the NH Primary Election.

On distance learning days, teachers will offer office hours to provide support for our students. Students are given the choice of both morning and an afternoon timestamp to attend for each subject if they need help/enrichment/reteaching, etc. Office hours are optional for students.

A few important points:

- Classwork will be posted by teachers in Schoology.
- Office hours will be hosted through the Microsoft Teams platform and links to each office hour will be posted in Schoology.
- School Counselors and administrators will be available via email for students and families.
- Enrichment activities will be available in the library media center's course in Schoology.

Our character development theme for January is gratitude. Gratitude is defined as the quality of being thankful for where you are and what you have. I am grateful to be part of this kind and generous community.

I encourage you to talk with your students about their classroom discussions and talk about gratitude with your family.

>>> SCHOOL NURSE UPDATE



As we go into the winter months, please be aware we are continuing to see an increase in illness at school. Strep throat, Influenza, and COVID-19 are still occurring with regular frequency as are other respiratory and gastrointestinal illnesses. If you child presents with any potential symptoms such as cough, congestion, sore throat, headache, fever, extreme fatigue, diarrhea, or vomiting, please keep them home and call the MVMS nurses for guidance. Students should not be coming to school within 24 hours of any episode of vomiting or diarrhea and must be fever free off any medication for 24 hours before returning to school. The absence of a fever does not rule out contagious illnesses and if you suspect Strep throat, Influenza, or COVID-19, please call your child's PCP or access Urgent Care for an evaluation. Home testing for COVID-19 is still recommended for any COVID-19 symptoms and especially if there has been a known contact. If your child tests positive for COVID-19, keep them home and contact the MVMS nurses for guidance. The MVMS nurses serve as a resource for families as they navigate these and other illnesses, please call us with any questions or concerns, we are happy to help.


>>> LIBERTY HOUSE FUNDRAISER

Happy New Year. Let's make it a happy one for them as well! Mrs. Nelson & Team 8-2





Fun Fact: Mr. Forsythe is a Recognized Escape Room Record Holder in the New England area.





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






Book Fair Thank Yous

Horse Powered Reading integrates social emotional learning with academics to improve literacy.

Connecting with horses reinforces basic skills, effectively motivates learners, and encourages learning retention in a non-traditional, and supportive environment.

Horses are natural teachers. Each have a distinct personality, along with defined social roles within their herds, allowing students to identify, relate to, and connect with them.

Horses help participants reflect on how we approach relationships, learning, and challenges.

Each session is tailored to individual needs and the content for each session varies depending upon the skills being addressed. The horses are honest and present and respond openly without pretense. During Horse Powered Reading, the horse 'becomes the book' - the metaphore for connecting with the text, or content of the book. Horses offer immediate feedback for experiential learning to take place.
