Dear MVMS Community,

MVMS will begin administering the New Hampshire Statewide Assessment System (NHSAS) starting on March 5th. This year there will be two assessment windows for all students in Grades 5-8. The first window is for the writing portion of the assessment and will be open from March 5th through March 15th. The second window will be for reading, math, and science and will be open from April 2nd until May 10th. Please note that the Science assessment is only administered in Grades 5 and 8. All of these assessments provide us with valuable information regarding students' learning as well as information that may guide curricular decisions. I would like to request all families help to support our students by reminding them to get plenty of rest and to eat a healthy breakfast. We will also be sending home information for families to write notes of encouragement to their student. We will provide incentives and snacks during testing days to encourage students to do their best on the assessments.

TEST TAKING TIPS

- Take a few deep breaths and relax tense muscles repeat throughout the test.
- Eat a good breakfast the morning of the test. High-protein foods like scrambled eggs are often best for aiding concentration and minimizing fatigue
- Get a full night's sleep before the test. A lack of sleep can affect your performance.
- Wear comfortable clothing.
- Bring an independent reading book in case you finish early.

>>> SCHOOL NURSE UPDATE

Please be aware we are continuing to see an increase in illness at school. Strep throat, Influenza, and COVID-19 are still occurring with regular frequency as are other respiratory and gastrointestinal illnesses. If you child presents with any potential symptoms such as cough, congestion, sore throat, headache, fever, extreme fatigue, diarrhea, or vomiting, please keep them home and call the MVMS nurses for guidance. Students should not be coming to school within 24 hours of any episode of vomiting or diarrhea and must be fever free off any medication for 24 hours before returning to school. The absence of a fever does not rule out contagious illnesses and if you suspect Strep throat, Influenza, or COVID-19, please call your child's PCP or access Urgent Care for an evaluation. Home testing for COVID-19 is still recommended for any COVID-19 symptoms and especially if there has been a known contact. If your child tests positive for COVID-19, keep them home and contact the MVMS nurses for guidance. The MVMS nurses serve as a resource for families as they navigate these and other illnesses, please call us with any questions or concerns, we are happy to help.

To: Parents/Guardians of Students on Goffstown Bus Routes 3,14, and 15: Great news to share.

Effective Monday, March 4, 2024 – STA/Goffstown Truck Center is adding a new bus route (#16) in the Grasmere section of Goffstown. The new bus route # 16 includes the following streets/roads: Mo-Sett, Miles, Amoskeag, Monarch, Tirrell Hill, and Montelona.

This new bus route (#16) will alleviate overcrowding on three existing routes: 3,14, and 15.

Bus Change Highlights:

Only bus routes 3,14,15, and the new route #16 are impacted. (Grasmere neighborhood of Goffstown)

There will be very minor changes to pickup/drop off times on routes 3,14, and 15 (around 5-minute deviations)

What Schools and Bus Routes are Impacted? (See below for revised bus routes)

Glen Lake AM and PM, Maple, MVMS are impacted.

New Bus Route #16 is being created.

We hope you can join us in celebrating their work.







RESILIENCE REINS Overview for Parents and Caregivers



This program connects, engages and encourages healing for young survivors of trauma, their families and caretakers.

The primary focus of the program is building and fostering feelings of confidence and resilience.

Youth participants focus on 'words of the day' featuring three overarching messages: communication, security, and identity while working with UpReach horses.

Participants often express feeling calm and happy while working with the ponies and perceive the barn as a safe place for learning skills to build healthy relationships along with trusted adults and peers.

While the youth are working with the ponies, parents and caregivers participate in Parent Cafe with a trained facilitator to learn about key protective factors for resilient families and discuss parenting challenges in a safe, supportive and hopeful environment.

"I learned that, to get the horse to trust me, I need to trust myself. I learned that I am trustworthy, and I can do it, even when it's hard." -10 Year-old Resilience Reins Participant

- 7-Week equine-assisted learning program to support and build resilience for youth trauma survivors, ages 8 - 17.
- Curriculum specifically developed for trauma survivors by Dr. Rebecca Bailey, PhD. Co-
- facilitated by Equine Specialist in Mental Health and Learning and a mental health professional.

Family and Community Engagement
