Upcoming Enrichment Activity: Introduction to Chess

Mountain View Middle School is excited to offer an <u>Introduction to Chess</u> course beginning on Tuesday, October 12 from 3:20-4:20 PM. This course will occur every Tuesday for four weeks, and end on November 2nd. Mountain View's very own, Mr. Howard McDowell, will be the instructor for this course. Mr. McDowell is an avid chess player who has spent his entire life studying the game and playing against world renowned competition. He received his formal training from a Life Master. Permission forms are located in the front office if you are interested. The course will occur on 10/12, 10/19, 10/26, and 11/2 from 3:20-4:20. Introduction to chess will be capped at 20 participants. All completed permission forms should be returned to Mr. Lyle Hamel in the front office.

Upcoming Enrichment Activity: Explora Vision

Mountain View is excited to share another exciting enrichment activity titled <u>ExploraVision</u>. ExploraVision is a science competition that engages students in next generation, real-world problem solving, with a targeted focus on STEM (science, technology engineering, and math). Facilitating this enrichment activity will be seventh grade science teacher, Mr. Davis. Mr. Davis will assist students in considering a real-world problem, developing a solution, and then envisioning a feasible way to solve the problem 10 years down the road. There will be an emphasis on collaborative brainstorming, research around current science and technology, as well as, critical thinking and communication skills. Mr. Davis has elected to facilitate the following two sessions.

- Grade 5/6 Session: Tuesdays from 3:10-4:45 PM
- Grade 7/8 Session: Thursdays from 3:10-4:45 PM

The ExploraVision enrichment activity with Mr. Davis will begin the week of October 25th and run through the week of January 24th, 2022. ExploraVision will be capped at 8 students for both the Grade 5/6 session and the Grade 7/8 session. Permission forms are located in the front office if you are interested. All completed permission forms should be returned to Mr. Lyle Hamel in the front office.

In the event that student interest exceeds program capacity (<u>Introduction to Chess</u> or <u>ExploraVision</u>), school administration will use a lottery system to determine the selected students. All candidates must be in good academic standing in all classes.

Update from the Nurses:

Dear Parents & Guardians:

We truly appreciate all of your efforts in reducing the risk of COVID-19 transmission in our schools. As a reminder, if your student is exhibiting any symptoms of COVID-19, even mild, we ask that you keep your student home from school and contact your student's primary care provider. Many of the symptoms of COVID-19 are similar to the common cold, influenza, allergies and other illnesses. While it may appear that your student just has the common cold or allergies, **healthcare providers cannot rule out COVID-19 without testing for it**. The MVMS nurses have been, and will continue to send students home who are symptomatic at school. As a reminder the symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- Headache
- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Sore Throat
- Runny nose or nasal congestion
- Muscle or body aches
- Fatigue
- New loss of taste or smell

- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If your student has been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19, please contact the MVMS nurses for guidance. Please contact the MVMS nurses if your student experiences any of the above symptoms or you have questions about COVID-19 exposure **before sending them to school**.

We are a resource for you and your family. We are happy to assist you during this unprecedented time. Together we can keep our families healthy and our schools open.

Information Center: Before and After School Hours

The Information Center is at 7:45 am every morning. In the morning, students can get a pass from a bus duty teacher or the main office. After school, the Information Center is open 3:10 pm - 4:45 pm, Monday-Thursday. The information center is NOT open after school on Friday. If a student plans to come to the Information Center after school, they need to sign up in the main office by 1:00pm. Students need to have a reason for coming to the Information Center, for example, using a computer for schoolwork, printing, checking out a book, independent reading, etc. If you have questions, please connect with Mrs. O'Riley at amy.oriley@sau19.org.



Arrival and Dismissal

Entrances by Grade Level – Students will enter the building through their assigned grade level door.

- 5th and 6th grade students will enter and exit through the door near the softball field.
- 7th and 8th grade students will enter and exit through the door near the back parking lot.

Morning Arrival – Parent/Guardian drop-offs will occur from 8:00-8:15. Please follow the updated traffic pattern (utilizing the back bus loop around the building). Bus Drop-offs will occur from approximately 8:15-8:25 AM, and will utilize the same entrances. If your student walks to school, or if you are dropping your student off **after 8:15**, **please use the front entrance only**. The back bus loop is only available until 8:15 to allow for busses to arrive safely and efficiently to continue their routes.

- All 5th and 6th grade students will report directly to their homeroom.
- $\circ~$ All 7 th and 8 th grade students will report directly to the gymnasium.

Afternoon Dismissal – Parent/Guardian pick-up will occur during the following timestamps. Parents will continue to use the back bus loop and students will exit the building using the same assigned grade level doors as morning arrival. Parent or guardian pick-up will occur from 2:45-3:05 PM.

- A-K: Students who have a last name beginning with A-K will be dismissed at 2:45. Parents are asked to arrive between 2:45-2:55 PM to keep traffic flow. Cars may not enter the back of the building after 3:05 PM.
- L-Z: Students who have a last name beginning with L-Z will be dismissed at 2:55. Parents are asked to arrive between 2:55-3:05 PM to keep traffic flow. Cars may not enter the back of the building after 3:05 PM.
- Please do your best to arrive no earlier than the prescribed time above so we are able to keep the traffic flow safe and efficient. If you are unable to pick up your student before 3:10, please communicate this with your student so they do not exit the building early for dismissal. Families are welcome to pick their student up between 3:10-3:25, in the front of the building, if the timestamps above do not meet your family needs.
- All students taking the bus, students who are 'late' pick-ups and walkers will be dismissed beginning at 3:10 PM. Walkers should exit the front of the building.

As a friendly reminder, please drive <u>slowly</u> around the back-bus loop while picking up/dropping off your student. All students should also enter/exit the car from the passenger side of the vehicle at arrival and dismissal.

PowerSchool Access

Families that are new to MVMS will receive an email to sign up for PowerSchool access. Those families that already have a PowerSchool account will have access to their account using their username and password from last year. As a reminder, all 7th and 8th grade students have access to view their classes and grades in PowerSchool too!

Masks

On August 16th, the Goffstown School Board determined we will start the school year with masking being optional. Masks will not be required indoors or for outdoor classroom activities. A targeted mask model was presented to the Goffstown School Board (See the reopening plan on the SAU19 website for details). Targeted masking decisions may be made for unique school specific case data and may be made by based on a number of cohorts or configurations such as: busses, classrooms, grade levels, school(s), etc. As, we head into the school year, masking should be viewed based on a continuum from optional to targeted to universal and may be differentiated by (and possibly within) each school. Masks will not be implemented in a binary model where masks are 'required or they are not'. Rather a specific, targeted-model, based on case data (local cases, school transmission, etc.) and NHDHHS recommendations (if applicable) will be implemented. Targeted masking will allow the SAU to respond to specific case data. The Superintendent is authorized to change or alter mask expectations and will report to the School Board.

Text Message Alerts

Opt-in to receive school delay and cancelation alerts, as well as emergency notifications. To opt-in, text the word "Yes" to the code number 67587. *Please note: Mobile numbers must be on file in our database (PowerSchool) to opt-in. To update your mobile number contact the school office.

Reporting an Absence

Parent/guardian should call (603) 497-8288, when prompted press 2 to report a student absence. Parent/guardian should be prepared to record their name, their student's name, and the name of their student's teacher(s). A note from a parent/guardian should be presented to the homeroom teacher upon return to school.

Emergency Release

The Goffstown School District uses a district wide notification system called School Messenger. This system allows more effective communication with parents should an emergency issue arise. This includes school cancelations, delays or early dismissals due to poor weather or building emergencies such as loss of heat, water pressure or electricity. Every means of communication will be used to notify parents and guardians. In addition to School Messenger, any school closing or delay because of weather conditions will continue to be announced on WMUR-TV, Channel 9, as well as over the radio station 95.7 FM WZID before 7:00 a.m. Please refrain from calling the school. Parents should have an emergency plan in place with their student for the rare occasion they may need to be sent home early.

The Late Bus

The Late Bus will run during the 2021/2022 school year. The Late Buses will pick students up from MVMS at 5:00. One bus will be for New Boston residents and one bus will be for Goffstown residents. The Goffstown Network was established in 1991 and is a non-profit community-based organization dedicated to providing food to the residents of Goffstown, Dunbarton and New Boston in times of crisis. The organization operates a bi-weekly food pantry and also runs a holiday program.

SAU #19 partnered with the Goffstown Network and established a "Weekend Lunch Program" for Goffstown and New Boston students who have limited access to food between school lunch on Friday and breakfast on Monday. We invite you to participate in the selection process to ensure that we are reaching the children who are most in need of this service. Beginning on Friday afternoon, September 17th, students will receive a bag of nutritious easy-to-open prepared food items which will be carried home in their backpacks.
