#### Arrival/Dismissal

Please take a few minutes to watch a video about our new arrival and dismissal procedures: <u>Arrival &</u> <u>Dismissal</u>

#### Arrival:

- Student Drop-Off begins at 8:00 AM.
- Students who need to complete academic work can access the information center at 7:45 AM. Students must have a pass from the office.
- There is a **<u>new traffic pattern</u>** this school year:
  - Buses will go behind the building (left at the bottom of the driveway).
  - Families will use the front main entrance (right at the bottom of the driveway).
- All students will be dropped off at the front entrance.
- Walkers should enter the front of the building and report to their assigned area:
  - All 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will report directly to the playground.
    - All 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will report directly to the back parking lot.
- Parents should NOT drive around the back bus loop while dropping off their student.

#### Dismissal:

- All students will be dismissed at 3:10 PM.
- There is a **<u>new traffic pattern</u>** this school year:
  - $\circ$  Buses will go behind the building (left at the bottom of the driveway).
  - Families will use the front main entrance (right at the bottom of the driveway).
- All students will be picked up at the front entrance.
- Walkers should exit the front of the building and head to their assigned area.
- All 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will report directly to the playground.
- All 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will report directly to the back parking lot.
- Parents should NOT drive around the back bus loop while dropping off their student.
- MVMS offers a late bus that leaves MVMS at 5:00. Students must sign up in the office by 1:00 PM on the day they want to take the late bus.

#### Bus Pick Up/Drop Off

- Students will be picked up and dropped off at their assigned grade level area:
  - $\circ$  5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be dropped off near the playground.
    - 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will be dropped off near the back parking lot.

As a friendly reminder, please stay alert and drive <u>slowly</u> while picking up/dropping off your student. All students should enter/exit the vehicle from the passenger side at arrival and dismissal. Please pull your vehicle forward when waiting or before having your student enter the vehicle to maintain traffic flow.

#### The Late Bus

#### **Information Center**

The MVMS information center is open for students to access resources before and after school. The library is open before school starting at 7:45 and will remain open at the end of the school day until 4:45, Monday-Thursday. The information center will close at 3:10 on Friday. Students dropped off at 7:45 or picked up after 3:15 from the library need to enter and exit through the front lobby doors.

#### **Student Government**

Student government is a student led organization that promotes leadership skills and encourages students to give back to the Goffstown community. The advisors include: Mrs. Leonard from team 6-3, Ms. McNichols from team 5-2 and Mr. Lacasse from team 7-1! We meet at MVMS monthly after school from 3:15-4:15 in Mrs. Leonard's room 216. Students will contribute to school-wide activities and play their role in showing PAWS pride to the other students at the middle school. As a student government member, it is your voice that represents your grade level and raise awareness of what is being said. Some activities we have planned include: canned food drives, fundraisers, school dances, kindness day activities, spirit weeks, etc. We meet the second Wednesday of every month! The dates are as follows: 10/12, 10/26, 11/16, 12/14, 1/18, 2/15, 3/15, 4/12 and 5/17. Some dates may change due to unforeseen circumstances. We look forward to having you join us!



#### Update from the Nurses

The information below is designed to help parents in the event their child exhibits any symptoms consistent with COVID-19. Possible symptoms include:

Fever or chillsNausea/ Vomiting/ DiarrheaCoughSore throatFatigueMuscle or body achesHeadacheNew loss of taste or smellCongestion or runny noseShortness of breath or difficulty breathing

In general, any student who is sick should stay home until symptoms are improving or resolved. The MVMS nurses are happy to help determine when your child should return to school, please call or email for guidance. Below are the recommended steps if your child is sick:

- The CDC, NH DHHS, and SAU19 are still recommending that your child be tested for COVID-19 prior to returning to school. If positive for COVID-19, contact the MVMS nurses for guidance on isolation and return to school timeline.
- Testing can be performed by your child's PCP, at Urgent Care or via a home antigen test. If you don't have access to COVID-19 testing please contact your school nurse, we can help facilitate testing.
- If your child is sick, we ask that you have your student tested for COVID-19 **prior** to sending them back to school. Please email test results to the school nurse so we have up to date information in the event your child complains of illness at school. If your child exhibits COVID-19 symptoms at school, they may be dismissed for further evaluation.
- If a home antigen test is performed, please email the nurses a photo of the test with your child's name and the date of the test clearly noted in the photo.
- Per the CDC, a single negative antigen test **does not rule out COVID-19 infection**. If your child's symptoms persist or your child is at an increased risk for COVID-19 because of a close contact to a COVID-19 case or participation in a high-risk activity (large gatherings, travel, etc.) it is recommended that you repeat the test 48 hours after the first was done. A PCR test does not need to be repeated.
- If your child tests negative for COVID-19 but remains symptomatic we advise that you seek additional evaluation through your PCP or Urgent Care to rule out another illness.
- If anyone in your household tests positive for COVID-19, please contact the MVMS nurses for guidance, 50% of household contacts will go on to develop COVID-19. The MVMS nurses are here as a resource for families dealing with COVID-19 or any health-related issues.

#### **Reporting an Absence**

Parents and guardians should call (603) 497-8288, when prompted press 2 to report a student absence. Parents and guardians should be prepared to record their name, their student's name, and the name of their student's teacher(s). A note from a parents and guardians should be presented to the homeroom teacher upon return to school.

#### **Emergency Release**

The Goffstown School District uses a district wide notification system called School Messenger. This system allows more effective communication with parents should an emergency issue arise. This includes school cancelations, delays or early dismissals due to poor weather or building emergencies such as loss of heat, water pressure or electricity. Every means of communication will be used to notify parents and guardians. In addition to School Messenger, any school closing or delay because of weather conditions will continue to be announced on WMUR-TV, Channel 9, as well as over the radio station 95.7 FM WZID before 7:00 a.m. Please refrain from calling the school. Parents should have an emergency plan in place with their student for the rare occasion they may need to be sent home early.


