#### Dear MVMS Community,

We are excited to begin sharing information with the MVMS community regarding transition activities for the 2022-2023 school year. This week, I had the pleasure of visiting Maple Avenue, Bartlett, and New Boston Central School to introduce myself to our incoming students. These students as well as our current students will have an opportunity to get a 'taste' of Mountain View by viewing transition videos to help them get to know what to expect next year. Students who are new to MVMS will also be offered student ambassador visits to have the opportunity to ask questions of current MVMS students and staff. The student ambassador visits will take place during the school day. Transition videos, for each grade level, are available on our MVMS website for parents to view and discuss with their student. Incoming families are invited to attend our 5th and 7th grade transition nights at MVMS, Grade 7 on May 2nd and Grade 5 on May 4th.

All current students at MVMS in grades 5 through 7 and New Boston students transitioning to grade 7 will participate in step-up day on June 16th where they will meet staff and learn more about the opportunities and expectations for the next grade level.

Beyond our transition activities this spring, we are also planning a facility open house in August for students to be able to tour the building and see classrooms. More information about the date/times will be sent out later this school year.

In addition, during the week of May 8th, access for course selection in PowerSchool will be given to all parents of MVMS students, as well as the incoming students from our three sending schools. More information and directions to follow.

#### **Volunteer Information**

The Goffstown Police Department (GPD) has partnered with our district and will now accept SAU 19 volunteers at the police station during the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday. You do not need to make an appointment, but you will need to bring a photo ID with you and tell them you are an SAU 19 volunteer. In the event you cannot make it during these open hours, you may stop by the GPD at any time, but the availability of an officer to take your prints may be limited and you may have to wait for an available officer, or you may be asked to try again at a different date and time.

Once your fingerprinting is complete, GPD will provide you with an electronic receipt. This receipt needs to be sent to the SAU office along with the following forms. It is important that you know your prints are only good for 30 days from the day they are taken to the day they are received in Concord. Please return all documents to the SAU office as soon after fingerprinting as you can: A completed Criminal Record Release Authorization Form. Payment of \$\$21.25 made payable to State of NH — Criminal Records (personal checks or money orders are the only form of payment accepted) \* These forms need to be completed and available on the SAU website:

- Volunteer Information Sheet
- Volunteer Application Agreement Form
- Volunteer Confidentiality Agreement Form #1 (Goffstown & New Boston)
- Volunteer Confidentiality Agreement #2 (New Boston Only)
- Verification of Bullying Training Form

The Bullying Training can be found on our website. Volunteers are required to watch the video annually and submit the bullying training form to the SAU office to stay current on the list. Once your fingerprinting record check is returned to the SAU office, schools will be notified you are an approved volunteer. You should contact the school directly to confirm if you have been approved for volunteering. SAU 19 Volunteer polices can be found on our website: Volunteers and Volunteer Regulations.

Please note, this process may take up to 30 days. You must complete this process in a timely manner if you want to volunteer for a particular event. Any questions about this process can be directed to the SAU office at 603-497-4818.

#### **Nurse Update: Attention 6th Grade Parents**

The State of NH requires all students entering 7th grade to receive the **Tdap** vaccine (Tetanus and Pertussis) prior to the start of 7th grade. Most children receive this vaccine between ages 10-12. Many current 6th graders are still missing documentation of this vaccine. If your child received this vaccine, we ask that you send in a copy of their immunization record prior to the end of the school year. If your student has not had the Tdap vaccine, please make

arrangements with your child's health care provider for him/ her to receive this vaccine before the start of school in September and submit a copy of your student's vaccine record to the MVMS nurses once completed. Feel free to contact the MVMS Health Office with any questions or concerns.

#### **Emergency Release**

The Goffstown School District uses a district wide notification system called School Messenger. This system allows more effective communication with parents should an emergency issue arise. This includes school cancelations, delays or early dismissals due to poor weather or building emergencies such as loss of heat, water pressure or electricity. Every means of communication will be used to notify parents and guardians. In addition to School Messenger, any school closing or delay because of weather conditions will continue to be announced on WMUR-TV, Channel 9, as well as over the radio station 95.7 FM WZID before 7:00 a.m. Please refrain from calling the school. Parents should have an emergency plan in place with their student for the rare occasion they may need to be sent home early.


