We have some exciting news to share! Ilo (pronounced: "Ee-low"), pictured here is a Finnish Lapphund and certified Therapy Dog, who will be spending time at Mountain View Middle School. Ilo belongs to Mrs. Jordan, one of our School Counselors, and the two of them work as a certified Therapy Team. Ilo has spent time volunteering in a variety of settings including hospitals and nursing homes, and he is a gentle and calm boy that encourages everyone he encounters to "Wag more, worry less." Ilo and Mrs. Jordan are certified through Alliance of Therapy Dogs and have extensive training and testing to ensure the safety and therapeutic needs of the children and adults that they encounter in their work together.



Therapy dogs have a proven positive effect on student and staff well-being and are a perfect complement to our social emotional learning efforts at Mountain View

Middle School. Therapy dogs are not the same thing as service animals, which is an animal trained to help a specific individual. Therapy dogs are trained with their owner to provide emotional support for staff and students alike. Research has shown that therapy dogs support psychological and academic growth while increasing social skills and self-esteem in children. The benefits are numerous, and we are excited to bring this opportunity to our Mountain View students and staff. Ilo will be spending time at Mountain View interacting with students and staff utilizing a therapeutic schedule to visit classrooms and other areas of the building.

Reporting an Absence

Robotics and STEM Enrichment Activity at MVMS

We are excited to share that SAU #19 is offering a one-week intensive enrichment opportunity focused on Robotics and STEM related activities at Mountain View Middle School during the week of 6/26-6/29 from 8 AM to 3 PM. These two programs will run separately, but in tandem, so that each cohort of students are able to spend two days in each activity. The two cohorts will be broken up accordingly: Incoming 5th graders to MVMS (those students currently at Maple and Bartlett), as well as our current students at MVMS who are in 5th grade and will be entering 6th grade in the fall will be one cohort. The second cohort will consist of those MVMS students who will be seventh and eighth graders at MVMS in the fall, including those students at NBCS. These free enrichment programs will help support the grade level and school level transition for interested students by providing a purposeful and enriching activity while also offering students a familiarity with the building and some of MVMS's teaching staff. If you have more than one child who is in either cohort, please complete two separate forms.

Registration is open through Friday, June 2nd.

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Food Service Updates

If your student is changing schools within the district and has money on the account, the money will move with him/her. If you need a refund as your student is leaving the district and your child's account has \$10 or more left, please click on this link https://tinyurl.com/en9cyvzd to complete the form. It can take 2-3 weeks for a check to arrive. If your child owes money for meals, please pay this debt as soon as possible. If you have any questions, please contact your school's cafeteria. Volunteer Information

The Goffstown Police Department (GPD) has partnered with our district and will now accept SAU 19 volunteers at the police station during the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday. You do not need to make an appointment, but you will need to bring a photo ID with you and tell them you are an SAU 19 volunteer. In the event you cannot make it during these open hours, you may stop by the GPD at any time, but the availability of an officer to take your prints may be limited and you may have to wait for an available officer, or you may be asked to try again at a different date and time.

Once your fingerprinting is complete, GPD will provide you with an electronic receipt. This receipt needs to be sent to the SAU office along with the following forms. It is important that you know your prints are only good for 30 days from the day they are taken to the day they are received in Concord. Please return all documents to the SAU office as soon after fingerprinting as you can: A completed Criminal Record Release Authorization Form. Payment of \$\$21.25 made payable to State of NH — Criminal Records (personal checks or money orders are the only form of payment accepted) * These forms need to be completed and available on the SAU website:

- Volunteer Information Sheet
- Volunteer Application Agreement Form
- Volunteer Confidentiality Agreement Form #1 (Goffstown & New Boston)
- Volunteer Confidentiality Agreement #2 (New Boston Only)
- Verification of Bullying Training Form

The Bullying Training can be found on our website. Volunteers are required to watch the video annually and submit the bullying training form to the SAU office to stay current on the list. Once your fingerprinting record check is returned to the SAU office, schools will be notified you are an approved volunteer. You should contact the school directly to confirm if you have been approved for volunteering. SAU 19 Volunteer polices can be found on our website: Volunteers and Volunteer Regulations.

Please note, this process may take up to 30 days. You must complete this process in a timely manner if you want to volunteer for a particular event. Any questions about this process can be directed to the SAU office at 603-497-4818.

Nurse Update: Attention 6th Grade Parents

The State of NH requires all students entering 7th grade to receive the **Tdap** vaccine (Tetanus and Pertussis) prior to the start of 7th grade. Most children receive this vaccine between ages 10-12. Many current 6th graders are still missing documentation of this vaccine. If your child received this vaccine, we ask that you send in a copy of their immunization record prior to the end of the school year. If your student has not had the Tdap vaccine, please make

arrangements with your child's health care provider for him/ her to receive this vaccine before the start of school in September and submit a copy of your student's vaccine record to the MVMS nurses once completed. Feel free to contact the MVMS Health Office with any questions or concerns.

The Goffstown School District uses a district wide notification system called School Messenger. This system allows more effective communication with parents should an emergency issue arise. This includes school cancelations, delays or early dismissals due to poor weather or building emergencies such as loss of heat, water pressure or electricity. Every means of communication will be used to notify parents and guardians. In addition to School Messenger, any school closing or delay because of weather conditions will continue to be announced on WMUR-TV, Channel 9, as well as over the radio station 95.7 FM WZID before 7:00 a.m. Please refrain from calling the school. Parents should have an emergency plan in place with their student for the rare occasion they may need to be sent home early.
