### **Open Facilities**

MVMS will be open on August 22<sup>nd</sup> to allow families to take a self-guided tour. We encourage grades 5 & 6 to come 8:30-10:30 and grades 7 & 8 to come 10:30-12:00. Maps will be available at the front desk. Teachers will not be available; however, administrators will be in the building and will be able to answer any questions you might have.

#### **2022-2023 Bus Routes**

Bus routes for this school year are posted on the SAU19 website. Again this year, students will only be able to take their designated bus home. No passes will be accepted to ride a different bus. #### **Picture Day**

MVMS will have Picture Day on Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup>. Each student will receive a picture packet in homeroom. Students who are not purchasing a picture package will still have their photo taken for the MVMS yearbook.



#### **Arrival/Dismissal**

Please take a few minutes to watch a video about our new arrival and dismissal procedures: <u>Arrival & Dismissal</u>

#### Arrival:

- Student Drop-Off begins at 8:00 AM.
- Students who need to complete academic work can access the information center at 7:45 AM. Students must have a pass from the office.
- There is a **new traffic pattern** this school year:
  - o Buses will go behind the building (left at the bottom of the driveway).
  - o Families will use the front main entrance (right at the bottom of the driveway).
- All students will be dropped off at the front entrance.
- Walkers should enter the front of the building and report to their assigned area:
  - o All 5th and 6th grade students will report directly to the playground.
  - o All 7th and 8th grade students will report directly to the back parking lot.
- Parents should NOT drive around the back bus loop while dropping off their student.

#### Dismissal:

- All students will be dismissed at 3:10 PM.
- There is a **new traffic pattern** this school year:
  - o Buses will go behind the building (left at the bottom of the driveway).
  - o Families will use the front main entrance (right at the bottom of the driveway).
- All students will be picked up at the front entrance.
- Walkers should exit the front of the building and head to their assigned area.
- All 5th and 6th grade students will report directly to the playground.
- All 7th and 8th grade students will report directly to the back parking lot.
- Parents should NOT drive around the back bus loop while dropping off their student.
- MVMS offers a late bus that leaves MVMS at 5:00. Students must sign up in the office by 1:00 PM on the day they want to take the late bus.

#### **Bus Pick Up/Drop Off**

- Students will be picked up and dropped off at their assigned grade level area:
  - o 5th and 6th grade students will be dropped off near the playground.
  - o 7th and 8th grade students will be dropped off near the back parking lot.

As a friendly reminder, please stay alert and drive <u>slowly</u> while picking up/dropping off your student. All students should enter/exit the vehicle from the passenger side at arrival and dismissal. Please pull your vehicle forward when waiting or before having your student enter the vehicle to maintain traffic flow.



### First Day of School

On the first day, each student will receive their schedule and important announcements from their homeroom teacher. Students in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade will should report to their homeroom in 8:25 from the back parking lot. 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> will report directly to homeroom from the playground. Homeroom assignments will be available in PowerSchool beginning on the week of August 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### Information Center

Beginning September 14<sup>th</sup>, the MVMS information center will be open for students to access resources before and after school. The library is open before school starting at 7:45 and will remain open at the end of the school day until 4:45, Monday-Thursday. The information center will close at 3:10 on Friday. Students dropped off at 7:45 or picked up after 3:15 from the library need to enter and exit through the front lobby doors.

#### The Late Bus

The Late Bus will run during the 2022-2023 school year. The Late Buses will pick students up from MVMS at 5:00. One bus will be for New Boston residents, and one bus will be for Goffstown residents. Students must sign up in the front office by 1:00 to ride the late bus each day. Please see the bus information that will soon be posted on the SAU website in regard to the stops associated with the late bus.



### **Label Your Student's Clothing**

Every year our lost and found is overflowing with beautiful clothing, coats, lunch boxes, etc. Approximately 4 to 5 times a year we donate our lost and found to charity. Please take the time to label your student's clothing, backpacks, and lunchboxes, so we are able to return these items to your student. ### **Update from the Nurses: Attention 7th Grade Parents**

The State of NH requires all students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade to receive the **Tdap** vaccine (Tetanus and Pertussis) prior to the start of 7<sup>th</sup> grade. Most students receive this vaccine between ages 10-12. Many 7th graders are still missing documentation of this vaccine. If your student received this vaccine, we ask that you send in a copy of their immunization record. If your student has not had the Tdap vaccine, please make arrangements with your student's health care provider for him/ her to receive this vaccine before the start of school in September and submit a copy of your student's vaccine record to the MVMS nurses once completed. Feel free to contact the MVMS Health Office with any questions or concerns.

### **Sports Information**

**Goffstown School District Fall Sports Registration is now open!** Registration must be done by a parent or legal guardian using your existing PowerSchool access account. Note: Parents cannot create a new account online through the portal. See below for how to request an account.

To begin registration:

- 1. Go to sms.sau19.org from a web browser.
- 2. Enter your username and password and click Sign In.
- 3. Click on Forms in the left Navigation menu.
- 4. Complete all four Athletic Registration forms per student.

If you have forgotten your username and/or password, click on the "Forgot Username or Password" link:

**Forgot Username:** Click on the Forgot Username tab and enter your email address and click Enter. An automatic email will be sent to your email address as long as it finds a match in our system.

**Forgot Password:** Click on the Forgot Password tab and enter your username and email address and click Enter. An automatic email will be sent to you with a link to reset your password as long as it finds a match in our system. The password reset will expire in 24 hours. Check your junk mail if you don't get an email.

If you complete the above steps and still have issues or you would like to request a PowerSchool access account, please email <a href="mailto:debra.vallee@sau19.org">debra.vallee@sau19.org</a>. If your email address is already connected to an existing access account, you will be resent the directions to reset your password. The district processes new account requests within five business days.

## Reporting an Absence

Parents and guardians should call (603) 497-8288, when prompted press 2 to report a student absence. Parents and guardians should be prepared to record their name, their student's name, and the name of their student's teacher(s). A note from a parents and guardians should be presented to the homeroom teacher upon return to school.

# **Emergency Release**

The Goffstown School District uses a district wide notification system called School Messenger. This system allows more effective communication with parents should an emergency issue arise. This includes school cancelations, delays or early dismissals due to poor weather or building emergencies such as loss of heat, water pressure or electricity. Every means of communication will be used to notify parents and guardians. In addition

to School Messenger, any school closing or delay because of weather conditions will continue to be announced on WMUR-TV, Channel 9, as well as over the radio station 95.7 FM WZID before 7:00 a.m. Please refrain from calling the school. Parents should have an emergency plan in place with their student for the rare occasion they may need to be sent home early.



### Lighten your daily load.

Parents have enough to worry about. SafeStop puts key information at your fingertips so you won't lose time or energy wondering "where's the bus?".

### Set up SafeStop:

- 1. Download the SafeStop app from the App Store or Google Play.
- Enter the school access code provided below.
- Enter your child's unique Student ID.
- Select the (bus or route name based on school communications preference) you wish to track.
- Create alert zones around drop-off and pick-up points.

You're all set! You will be able to track the bus's movement during active route times and receive notifications when the bus enters your custom alert zone(s).

### Trust that your information is secure.

Security is priority one, especially where student information is concerned. All parent information is password protected within the app to prevent unauthorized people from accessing any student bus information.
