Office of the **PRINCIPAL**

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Ensuring the safety of our students is our utmost priority. With this objective in mind, we have established the following traffic patterns and expectations at Mountain View Middle School (MVMS) from 2:45 p.m. to 3:45 p.m. For families picking up their student(s) at the end of the school day, we kindly request the use of the right side of the driveway, accessed from Lauren Lane, leading to the front of the building. We ask families to exercise patience and utilize only one lane—the right lane —while approaching the driveway. Vehicles are not permitted to use the left-hand lane or pass vehicles waiting in line.

Upon dismissal, students have been asked to wait behind the white line on the sidewalk, near the front door of the building, until their ride arrives at the student loading area. To ensure traffic safety, students may not walk down to the bottom of the hill towards Lauren Lane to meet their families.

Important note: Cars are prohibited from entering the back of the building between 2:45 p.m. and 3:45 p.m. during bus arrival/loading. Additionally, parking at the baseball field, on the left side of the driveway is not permitted during dismissal time.

Families arriving for pick up prior to 2:30 p.m. should park in the main parking lot and wait for their student(s). Parking in the main lot prior to 2:30 not only avoids blocking the fire lane in the front of the building, but also leaves the driveway clear for those families that need to dismiss their student prior to 3:10. MVMS staff are on duty to supervise students at the parent pick-up area until 3:40 p.m. Families can arrive at MVMS anytime between 3:10 p.m. and 3:40 p.m.

Sports/Activity procedure:

Students dismissed for sports/activities prior to 2:45 p.m. should meet their ride at the back of the building, near the bus turnaround (next to the softball field). All cars must vacate the bus turnaround area by 2:45 p.m. Students will exit through the front door of the building and use the sidewalk to meet their ride for game/activity pick up. After 2:45 p.m., parking is only available in the main parking lot.

Parking for sports games and practices is restricted to the main lot ONLY prior to 3:45. Families are welcome to utilize the back lot beginning at 3:45 p.m. We truly appreciate your patience and understanding as we collectively work towards prioritizing the safety of our students.

>>> AFTERSCHOOL

Students staying at MVMS after school must be in a designated location, such as a sports event, the library, or a club. Classrooms and hallways will be locked after 4:00.



>>> SCHOOL NURSE

In the interest of the general health and well-being of all students and staff, no student who is ill should attend school. A student having a fever, sore throat, cough, severe congestion, vomiting or diarrhea, rash of unknown origin, or untreated impetigo, should not attend school. Students must be fever free for 24-hours without medication and have no episodes of vomiting/ diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school. Students who are deemed too ill to attend classes/ activities may be dismissed from school. If you are unsure if/when your child should return to school, please contact the school nurse for assistance prior to sending your student to school. Parents must ensure all emergency contact phone information is up to date in the event that the school must dismiss your student due to an emergency or illness.



>>> FOOD SERVICE UPDATE

Welcome back to the Hilltop Café! We hope you had a wonderful summer full of fun, family and friends! The monthly menu is posted on the school and food service website. It can also be found at <u>www.linqconnect.com</u>. All of our meals feature fresh fruits and vegetables, low fat milk, lean protein sources and whole grain bread offerings. Your child has a debit account automatically set up which tracks all payments and purchases. We offer breakfast, lunch and milk for purchase every school day. Breakfast is not served on delayed openings. Students may purchase additional snack items to go with their meal provided they have money on their account to spend. Your child uses the same lunch number as last year (even if your are coming from Maple Avenue, Bartlett or New Boston). If you don't know the number, please let the cafeteria know and we will gladly provide it. If your child does not know their number we will look them up alphabetically at the cash register. Cash or checks (made out to Goffstown Food Service) can be sent to the school for payment. Online payments can be made at <u>www.linqconnect.com</u>.

You can apply for the free and reduced meal program at any time during the year. Applications are available online at <u>www.linqconnect.com</u> or the food service website or by contacting the school cafeteria. If your child had this benefit last year, you will have 30 school days to reapply to determine if you will continue to receive this benefit.

Thank you to Mr. Glynn and his team for facilitating these activities.






Library/Media Center Information


