New News

Mountain View Ski Club

We are fast approaching the ski season. The MVMS Ski Program will begin Friday, January 3rd and will continue until Friday, January 31st. Buses will leave the school each week by 2pm. For those students that already have equipment, please leave it outside near the front office. Remind your child that it will be up to them to take it to the bus. Also, students are not allowed to bring their equipment on the bus in the morning. Parents will have to take it to the school. For those that ordered a season pass, you can go into the Pats Peak office and pick it up.

If your child is getting picked up at the mountain, please send Paola Gomes a note or an email ASAP. If someone other than yourself is picking up your child, she'll need a note from both parents saying both parties agree to the pick-up for that day. Please email Paola ASAP about

whether your child will be staying on the mountain with you or an adult (which means the adult picking up will have to come to the small lodge by 6pm to sign the student out). The program will need an accurate count of students as to who is riding the bus home.

If your child is taking the bus home, please go over with them about being at the bus area by 6:50PM. We strongly urge punctuality as it is difficult to keep everyone waiting in the cold weather and to also keep everyone waiting for pick-up back at MVMS. For those picking up at Mountain View, please be there no later than 7:50PM. ***And for those going on the Bartlett bus back at the end of the night, please let me know, and also make sure Mrs. Levine knows.***

Please remember to dress your children warmly. Waterproof gloves, wool socks (have them bring an extra pair, do not let them ski with their sweaty socks they wore all day), ski coat, helmet, and scarf will keep them safe and comfortable. Remind your child that on really cold days, they should return to the lodge frequently, to warm up (we recommend every other run). Safety should be their number one priority. Pats Peak will not cancel because it's cold. It is a cold weather sport. The only time we will cancel is when the SAU cancels school. In that case, they will extend the program one more week. Please add my phone number and email into your phone contacts as ski coordinator, so that if I call, you will remember who I am and answer the phone.

Health Corner

Cold Season Has Arrived

The Health Office is seeing a marked increase in children suffering from cold symptoms. Please be aware that we do not dispense cold medication of any kind at MVMS. If you would like your child to have cold medication, it must be given at home prior to the start of the school day. If you feel your child may need cold medication during the school day, it must be delivered by an adult, in the original package, accompanied by written parental permission to dispense. As always, if your child has a fever greater than 100 degrees, they are not permitted to be in school until they are fever-free for 24-hours. Please encourage your child to cover their cough, use a tissue for any nasal secretions, and wash their hands often to prevent the transmission of illness.
